





Healthy Reflections – Body, Mind and Spirit

Well – did you get your flu shot yet?

I delayed a bit this year, and guess what? I have been sick with the flu since last Friday. So

please, if you haven't already, get out there and get your influenza immunization. The flu season has started! You can get the regular seasonal immunization at any local pharmacy.

For those over 65 years of age you may want to consider the *High-dose inactivated influenza vaccine*. You will need to pay for this high-dose vaccine as it is not covered by OHIP. For those over 50 years of age, it is also recommended to discuss the vaccine for pneumonia with your physician. For those with chronic conditions or chronic respiratory problems this may also be a good investment in your health.



For questions about immunizations make an appointment to see your physician, talk to your pharmacist or to the Parish Nurse.



Equally important for preventing the spread of respiratory illnesses is respiratory hygiene and regular hand hygiene. Remember that the very young, the elderly and those with chronic illness are more susceptible to the severe complications of influenza. Let's be aware and protect each other.
